The professional growth of our staff has




always been one of our top priorities. In the first week of November, the teachers were again given a three-day intensive training to sharpen the skills required to transform the school's vision to reality.

# Teacher Training Programme

Prizes are distributed monthly for the Best Display. This month, Charity House bagged the First prize.




## Special Prayer for Rain


## Rainbow Day

Colours help children to understand the diversity of the world around them. Integrating colours in the curriculum prepares the little scholars to observe, comprehend, distinguish and categorize what they see.



Prizes are given every week to those students whose attire perfectly suits the vision of the Rainbow Week celebrations.

The objective of this activity is to introduce the alphabets and numbers to children and to familiarize them through Tracing.





## Show and Tell
